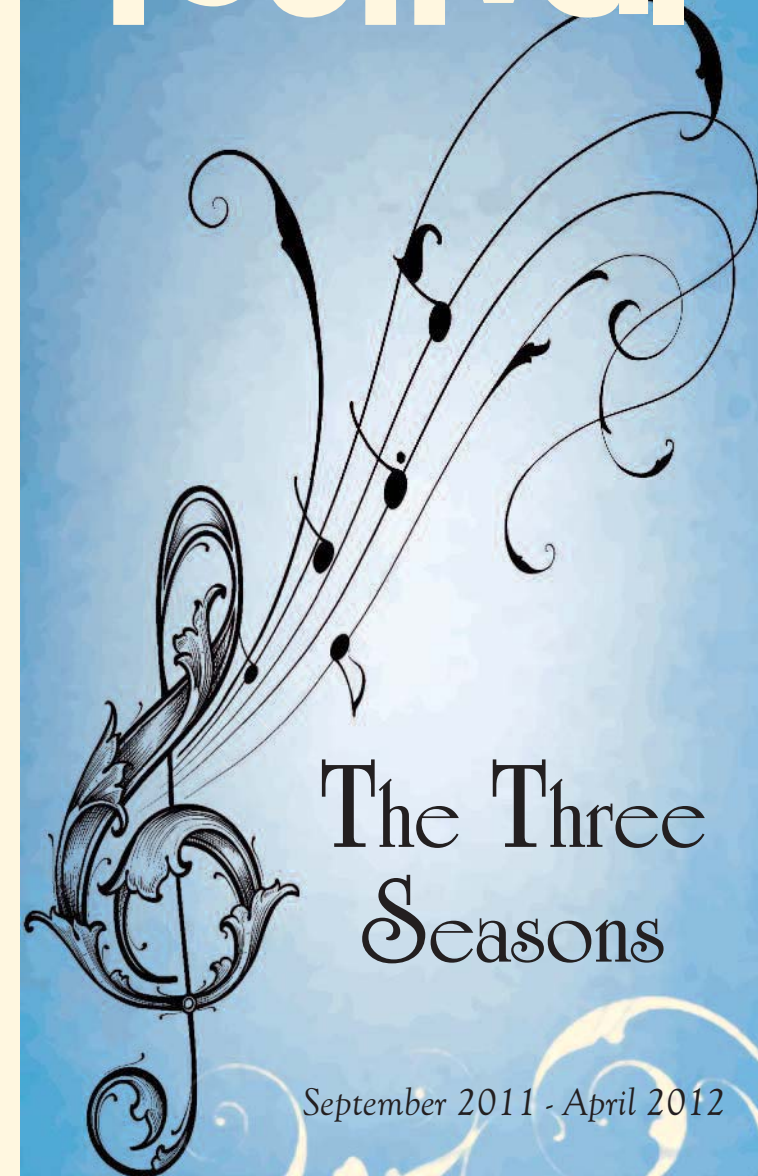

The English Chamber Orchestra is the most recorded chamber orchestra in the world with a discography containing 857 recordings of over 1,500 works by more than 400 composers. The orchestra has also performed in more countries than any other orchestra and played with many of the world's greatest musicians. Recent tours have taken the orchestra to Germany and Azerbaijan with Pinchas Zuckerman and Paul Watkins, Austria with Sir Colin Davis and the Bermuda Festival with Valdimir Ashkenazy. Future plans include a tour with Anne-Sophie Mütter and Yuri Bashmet.

Russian-born violinist Alexander Sitkovetsky made his concerto debut at the age of eight and the same year came to study at the Menuhin School in the UK where Lord Menuhin became his inspiration and his mentor. He is now in much demand as both a soloist and a chamber musician with a busy schedule taking him to Europe, Scandinavia, Asia and the USA.
