Taste The good, the bad, and the beautiful:
Deconstructing the standard

Curated by Dr Robert Anderson

In an intriguing exhibition, 'Taste' encourages you to make your own judgements about the good and bad qualities of material objects, paintings, buildings, clothes, writings, music, and ideas. It's likely we all have changing views of these over time: we will have been influenced by evolving views of society and what is deemed fashionable. We may not even realise the judgements we are making, so 'Taste' offers an opportunity to engage with how and why we are affected by the phenomenon.

The collection is considered historically from the 18th century to the present. Its *dramatis personæ* (characters) include figures who have influenced us in major, differing ways, such as David Hume, Hogarth, Pugin, Millais, Ruskin, Gerrit Rietveld, Tretchikoff, John Betjeman, and Jack Vetriano.

During the festival Patrick Hemmerlé, Sir Christopher Frayling, and Godfrey Evans all present talks on the subject. Details can be found in the listings pages.

Festival walking tour: Burneys of Georgian Lynn

with guide **Paul Richards**

2026 marks the tercentenary of the birth of organist, composer, and prominent music historian, Dr Charles Burney. Burney was a principal figure in the cultural life of Georgian England and spent his formative years in King's Lynn. Arriving in Lynn in 1751 as organist at St Margaret's, he soon established celebrity status in the town and county. His daughter, Fanny, was born in Chapel Street in 1752. She achieved fame as England's first bestselling female novelist and her diaries provide unique insights into upper crust life in Georgian Lynn. The tour treads the Burney family path, ending at The Minster.

The tour begins from St Nicholas' Chapel.

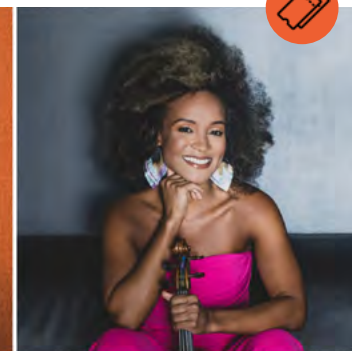

Musical taste

Patrick Hemmerlé

In this lecture, Patrick Hemmerlé will shed light on aspects of taste in music, a concept that has been much discussed by composers, performers, and music critics from the Baroque to the present. The talk, illustrated by recordings, as well as by examples played live, will show how each generation sets its own taste criteria. What seems desirable to one artistic movement can be considered outmoded, or even vulgar by the next generation. The important distinction between taste and fashion will also be considered. Musical examples will include works by Bach arranged by composers such as Gounod, Stokowski, or Busoni, as well as music by Mozart, Chopin, Liszt, and Mahler.

Design taste and origins of the V&A

Christopher Frayling

The inaugural exhibition at the Museum of Manufactures – the precursor of today's V&A – opened in 1852 with an attempt to demonstrate "correct" design and good taste by displaying examples of "utterly indefensible" design. This brainchild of Henry Cole, the Museum's first Director was affectionately referred to as "the chamber of horrors". The intended audiences were students of design, commentators, and shoppers who needed to be protected from selecting vulgar products. Although many were lost, all remaining exhibits have been assembled for this talk, which takes us round the "chamber of horrors" and revisits this doomed attempt to define good and bad taste...
